## RESISTANCE NOW: FREE CULTURE

A Campaign for Artistic Freedom and Cultural Autonomy in Europe



The **Resistance Now:** Free Culture campaign highlights the urgency of protecting artistic freedom and cultural autonomy in the face of growing political interference across Europe.

Building on the momentum of the **European Theatre Talks** in Liège and the **Resistance Now! Tour**, this campaign unites theatres, cultural organisations, and policymakers. Alarmed by the acute threat to cultural diversity in Europe, the leaders of almost 200 cultural organisations have joined forces to call on the European Parliament, with an Open Letter, to "finally take an explicit stand" on cultural autonomy and implement a **'European Culture Freedom Act'**.

As the largest network of public theatres in Europe, with 70 members from 33 countries, the **European Theatre Convention (ETC)** is at the forefront of this initiative, alongside **renowned theatre artist**, **director**, **and filmmaker Milo Rau**, the <u>Vienna Festival</u> (Wiener Festwochen) / Free Republic of Vienna, the <u>Prospero – Extended Theatre</u> platform and the network <u>Opera Europa</u>.

Central to the campaign is a commitment to highlighting theatre's role as both a space for open dialogue and a catalyst for meaningful societal transformation.

## RESISTANCE NOW: FREE CULTURE

The 'Resistance Now: Free Culture' initiative has marked a turning point in our campaign for European culture, launching a new level of action to confront these growing threats and advocate for theatre as a cornerstone of democracy.

In November 2024, together with Milo Rau and <u>Wiener Festwochen</u>, as well as the <u>Opera Europa</u> and <u>Prospero - Extended Theatre</u> networks, the European Theatre Conventionhas has launched an urgent initiative to stand against increasing threats to European cultural policy and artistic freedom, in the form of an open letter addressed to the European Parliament.

For the first time ever, over 200 leading artists and prominent personalities of major cultural public institutions from 50 countries representing 180 national theatres, operas, festivals, and performing arts venues, have come together to call for decisive actions now, including:

- Adopting a European Culture Freedom Act to safeguard artistic freedom.
- Establishing a clear EU stance to protect the independence and autonomy of cultural institutions.

The petition was publicly launched at the 10th stop of the Wiener Festwochen's Resistance Now! Tour, spearheaded by Milo Rau, at Le Maillon Theatre in Strasbourg:

On the same day, standing in front of the European Parliament, Milo Rau, Matej Drlička, Barbara Engelhardt (director of Le Maillon Theatre) and Heidi Wiley, Executive Director of the European Theatre Convention, held a copy of the Open Letter and sent a powerful message of solidarity from the cultural sector, calling on MEPs to take immediate action to provide the necessary European legal framework to protect these core European values: freedom of expression, artistic expression, and the independence of cultural institutions.



Since its official launch, and as of 04 December 2024, the petition has garnered nearly 1'900 signatures, most of them representing major cultural organisations in over 50 countries, and was extensively covered by press and shared on social media, reflecting broad support from across Europe and beyond.

In the following section, you will find an overview of the press and social media coverage of the campaign, a testament to what can happen when we stand together. Our strength as sector comes in uniting our voices and our networks in view of the ongoing crises and shifting political paradigms, highlighting the essential role of culture in shaping an open, democratic society where individuals are free to choose how to live.

## BACKGROUND

We believe it is essential for theatres and the performing arts to play a key role in building an open, democratic society where people are free to choose their way of life. To achieve this, we must take a stand—and do so together. Our strength, as a cultural sector, lies in uniting our voices and networks to address current crises and political paradigm shifts.

Ahead of the European Parliament elections, ETC published in May 2024 a statement addressing Europe's increasing polarisation titled: "Theatres are ideal spaces for dialogue. Europe needs them now more than ever," calling on Europe to protect theatres and public spaces that keep freedom of expression alive.

In June 2024, ETC began receiving weekly calls from Member Theatres in Slovakia (Slovak National Drama Theatre) and Bulgaria (National Theatre Ivan Vazov, seeking guidance on navigating increasing political interference. Recognising the urgency of the situation, the ETC Board resolved to make this a central focus of the European Theatre Talks in Liège that November, ensuring the issue received the attention and dialogue it demanded.

In August 2024, ETC issued a new statement expressing deep concern about the Slovak Ministry of Culture's decision to dismiss the General Manager of ETC Member Slovak National Theatre, Matej Drlička, in what appeared to be part of a worrying trend by far-right parties across Europe to limit freedom of expression.

In September 2024, ETC signed and supported the publication of a joint call from the European Cultural Sector to call for artistic freedom and the autonomy of the arts, addressed to the Members of the European Parliament (MEPs).

The declaration, released in the name of the cultural network <u>Culture Action Europe</u> (CAE), was jointly prepared by the <u>European Theatre Convention</u> alongside CAE, <u>Pearle Live Performance Europe</u>, and <u>Opera Europa</u>, and urged European politicians to adequately protect freedom of expression for artists, highlighting the sector's united stance.


In November 2024, ETC held the third edition of the European Theatre Talks, a high-profile theatre and policy event that emerged following the European Theatre Forum event in 2023, which collected the shared needs and desires of the European Theatre sector in a resulting policy document, called the Opole Recommendations. The goal of these talks is to implement the recommendations in this document through consistent dialogue with policymakers.

This edition, titled 'Free Culture: Resisting Political Interference' served as a strong reminder of the relevance of theatre to society, through inputs from Georg Häusler, Director for Culture, Creativity and Sport in the European Commission (DG EAC); investigative journalism outlet Correctiv; Austrian playwright Elfriede Jelinek; European cultural networks Pearle\* and Opera Europa; and a condensed insight into the sobering State of Culture Report by Culture Action Europe.

A marking intervention from Mladen Aleksiev, Head of International Relations at Bulgaria's National Theatre Ivan Vazov, shed light on the intimidation surrounding their production of *Arms and the Man*, directed by John Malkovich. The European Theatre Convention (ETC) called on citizens and policymakers to stand in solidarity with the theatre and defend freedom of expression, in a statement that was **extensively shared and viewed by 90.000 people.**

It is an arts organisation that promotes European theatre as a vital platform for dialogue, democracy and interaction that responds to, reflects and engages with today's diverse audiences and changing societies. ETC's programme of grants and events support networking, professional development and artistic collaborations for theatre staff across Europe — championing theatre as a key European art form for the 21st century.

ETC has 70 members in 33 countries and is supported by the Creative Europe Programme of the European Union. We estimate the theatres perform 60.000 shows per year, reaching 25 million audience members, and have a crucial role to play in supporting democracy.
